When the district completely vets and approves the new social emotional curriculum, we will work to implement that in classrooms. We have hired a second behavioral assistant with TSSA funds who helps with students who are showing internalizing behaviors such as anxiety and being withdrawn. All teachers are implementing Morning Meetings. The school schedule supports time for Morning Meetings. The SCC budgeted money for teachers to build de-escalation or wellness corners in teacher's rooms. The Building Leadership Team will work with grade levels on these corners. We have a fully staffed wellness room with access to our school social worker. We have a .80 social worker partially paid for with TSSA funds who will run groups to help students deal with anxiety and social concerns. All staff will complete state mandated trauma training by the end of the year. Staff has been trained in restorative processes to help students work through conflict resolution in a positive manner.

We retrain the staff and retrain the students each year on lock down procedures. We practice the lock down procedures in a very calm way - in order not to traumatize students. Teachers leave emergency procedures for their substitutes to be informed in case of an emergency.</p> <p>2. Resource Officer: We have a Sandy PD police officer, Officer Brian Peters, that serves as our school resource officer. They have ongoing training to be prepared for a crisis situation. Officer Peters spends half of his time at Union - he splits his time with Albion Middle. He is creating positive relationships with students, but also is on alert for any potential threats.</p> <p>3. Mental Health Supports: We have 3 counselors, a social worker, a school psychologist, and a therapist addressing the mental health needs of our students.
