### 4. New Business

A. Review of school status levels Tier 2 and Tier 3 of school opening plan (Possible Action) – Superintendent Rick Robins

Superintendent Rick Robins presented additional clarifying language for school communities in Tier 2 to include, "mitigation strategies such as increased cleaning and sanitation efforts, a reduction in adult visitors and volunteers in the school building, further limitations to in-person meetings, and community-awareness campaigns will be developed and put into place." Additional clarification was added to a traditional high school that reaches the 1 percent case rate to read, "other precautionary measures, such as specific group-activity and/or event temporary suspension or cancellation; the temporary adoption of a split or hybrid schedule; a change to an online-learning-only schedule; and a three-day school closure and pivot to online-instruction-only to allow for deep cleaning and sanitation at the building."

The Board suggested adding language which encourages adhering to health safety practices while not in school to the vigilance letter that is sent to parents/guardians when a school community is in the Tier 2 level.

<u>MOTION:</u> Clareen Arnold moved to approve the clarifying language in the Board adopted framework as presented on BoardDocs. Amber Shill seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

There was discussion to the motion by the Board of Education.

<u>MOTION:</u> Nancy Tingey moved the Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent to make decisions regarding mitigation strategies for schools in Tier 3. Steve Wrigley seconded the motion. Nay 3 (Ms. Arnold, Ms. Oaks, Mr. Iverson) Yea 4(Mr. Millerberg, Ms Shill, Ms. Tingey, Mr. Wrigley). The motion carries.

The Superintendent indicated further research needs to be done for Draper Park Middle school in regards to the school case counts to confirm with the County Health Department before a decision is made with that school. B. Proposal for adjustment to in-person school schedules (Possible Action) – Superintendent Rick Robins

Principals from Elementary, Middle and High schools expressed concerns regarding the tremendous work load and unprecedented stress that educators are experiencing from the additional work load to effectively meet the needs of all students within current COVID19 restrictions.

The School Performance directors presented options with pros/cons for modified in-person school schedules or a Districtwide Early-release.

The District received information from the State Board of Education indicating a waiver for the hours of instruction will not be required because Canyons has adopted policy for a learner validated program and enrollment measures (500.35-Student Attendance) which will be sufficient to meet the state board rule requirements.

<u>MOTION:</u> Amber Shill moved to approve a 4-day in person and 1-day virtual school learning model for the 2020-2021 school year. Steve Wrigley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

There was discussion to the motion by the Board of Education. The 4-day in-person school week will begin on Monday October 5, 2020. The Board of Education requested a report back, prior to winter break on the progress of this learning model.

<u>MOTION:</u> Clareen Arnold moved to approve the modified in person four-day full schedule with Friday designated as the virtual learning day. Steve Wrigley seconded the motion. The motion passed . Yea 5 (Ms Arnold, Ms.Oaks, Ms. Shill, Ms. Tingey, Mr. Wrigley), 0 Nay, 2 Abstain (Mr. Iverson, Mr. Millerberg).

C. Online learning update - Superintendent Rick Robins

Dr. Amber Roderick Landward presented data for on-line and in-person learning from August 14, 2020 to September 22, 2020 in elementary, middle and high schools. Teachers are managing multiple learning environments simultaneously as they teach in-person, online and support students in quarantine. An online program was developed in under 30 days with an increase in rigor, consistency and alignment to standards, from what took place at the end of the previous school year. The community is reaching out to express gratitude for the online option. The collaboration across the district between educators and schools has increased. The feedback regarding challenges include time supporting technology questions, preparation time needed to provide effective online instruction, varied expectations, and course accessibility. Canyons is currently working to clarify expectations of stakeholders, provide more tech support to families and provide teachers with more time.
